



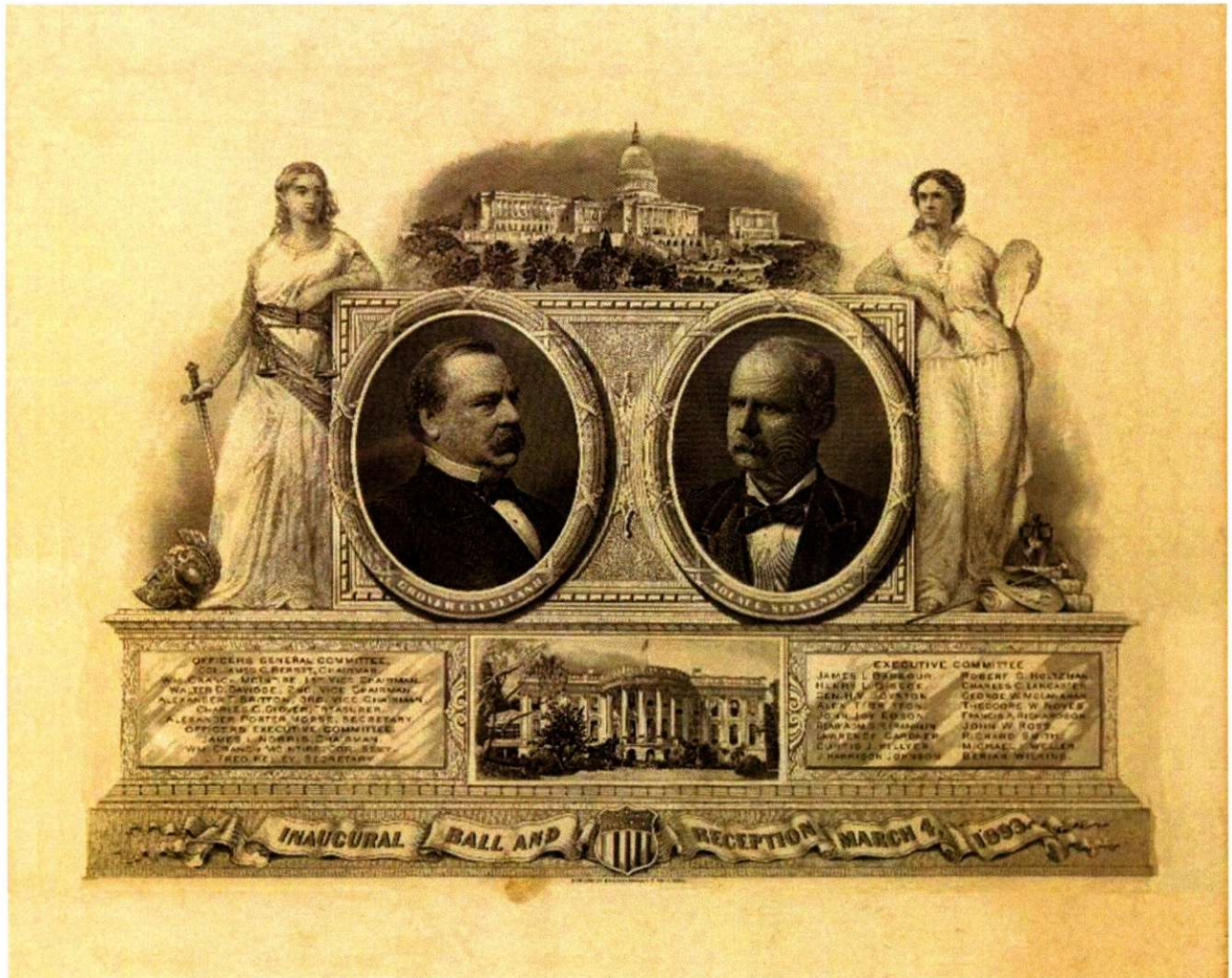

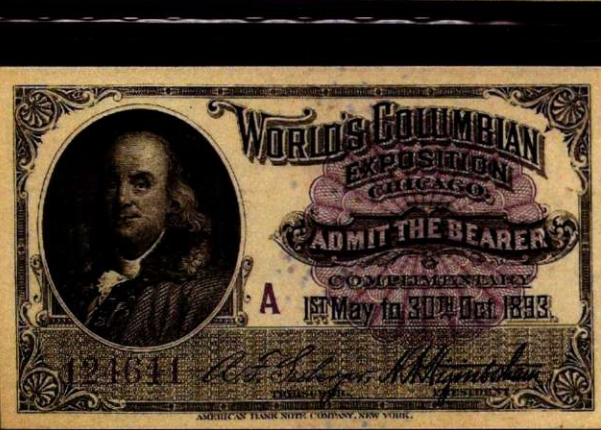
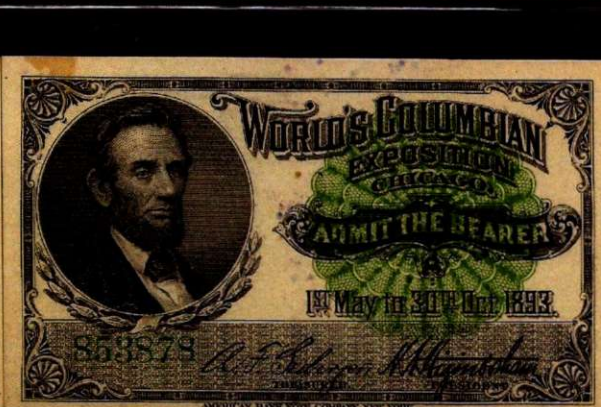

PAUL REVERE

An article, "Painting the Revolution" in the Book Review section of *The New York Times*, Sunday, 4 December 2016, caught my eye. It reproduced John Singleton Copley's 1768 portrait of Paul Revere (1735-1818), patriot, craftsman and engraver, designed and printed the first issue of Continental paper money.

I knew the image had been reproduced on a card.



Copley's painting (below, left) was engraved by Thomas Hipschen in 1976 (below, right). I do not know the original use of the engraving, but it was used on an invitation to the BEP's Design Center Opening, on 15 January 1987. It appears again on the ANA 2010 card (B298) in the lower left corner.

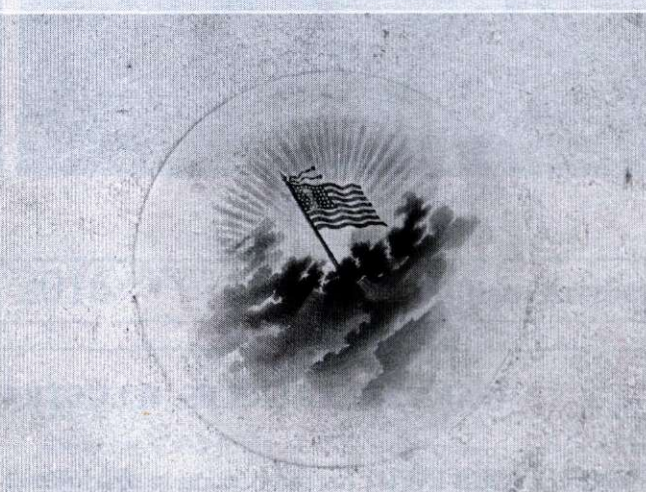
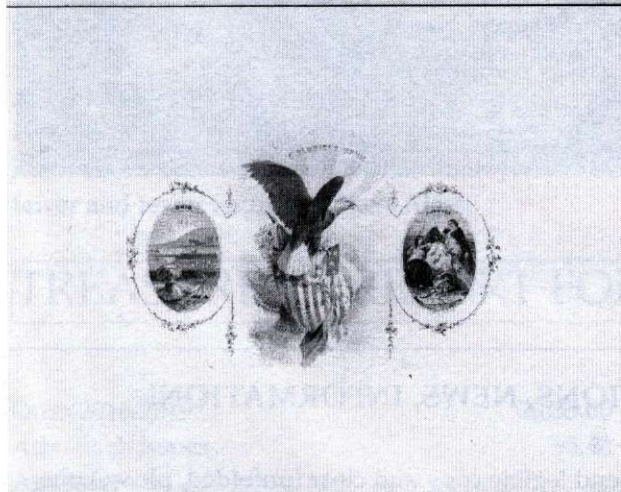
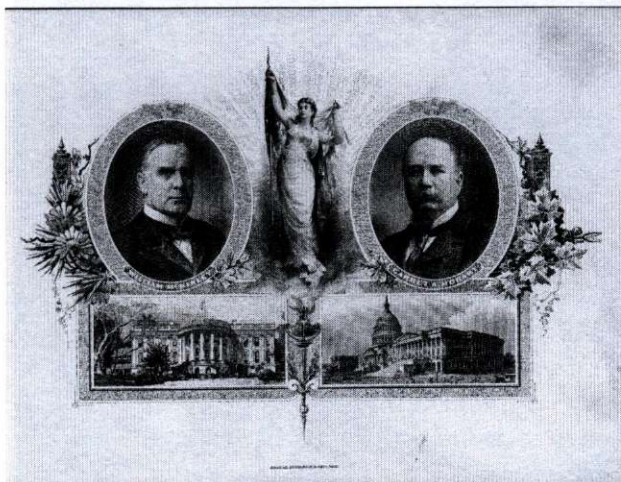

1897 Inaugural Ball Program

The ball was held in the Pension Building, shown on the cover [right]. (Now the National Building Museum.) Bailey, Banks & Biddle produced the front and back cover [flag, below]. The BEP engraved and printed the Committee card and the portrait card. I believe they also produced the eagle card with the Ohio and New Jersey state seals, but it doesn't have a BEP imprint. All contents are 10"x7", bound by a silk ribbon. [Ball held on 4 March 1897.]



[William McKinley (1843-1901), our 25th President, was assassinated while attending the Pan American Exposition in Buffalo, NY. He was our third president to die in such a manner.

Garret A. Hobart (1844-1899), his Vice-President, died of heart disease at age 55, the sixth to die in office. His replacement was Theodore Roosevelt. Ed.]

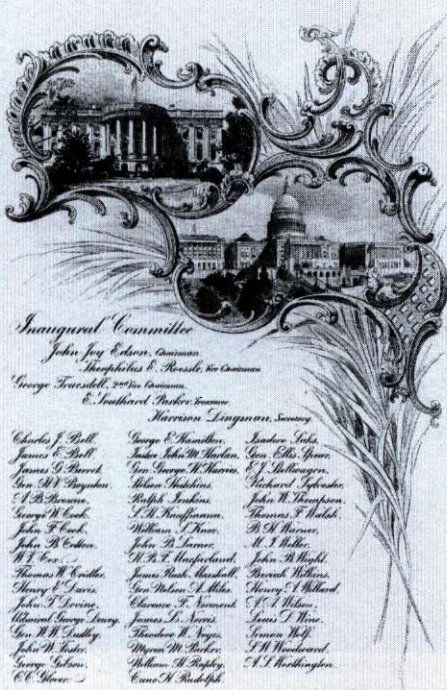
The 1901 Inaugural Souvenir Book

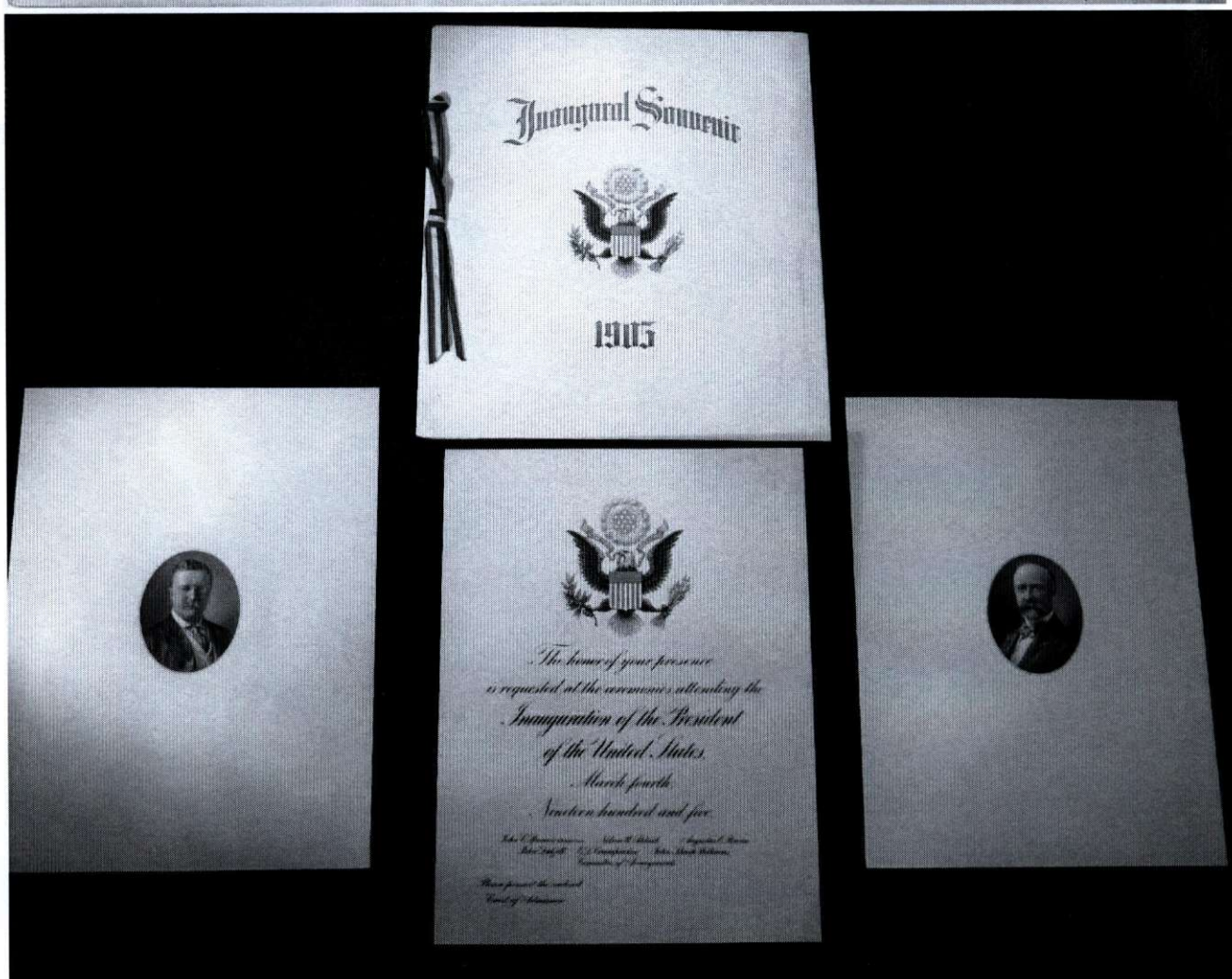

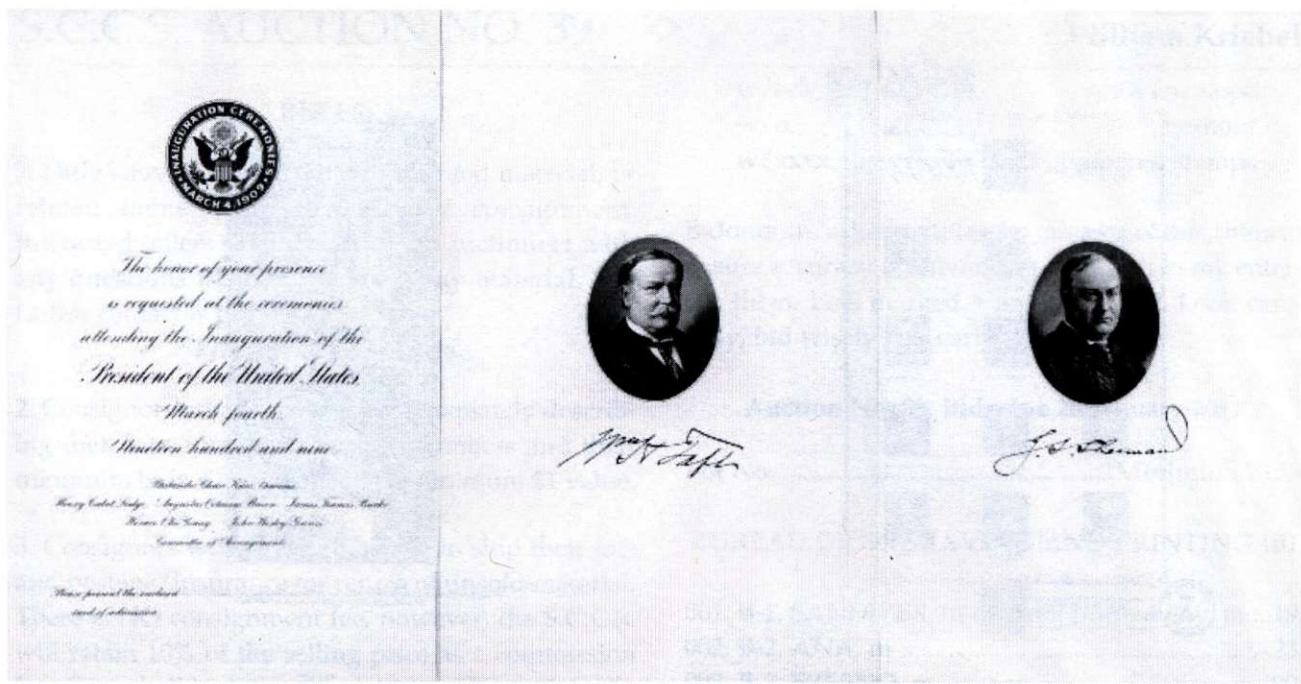

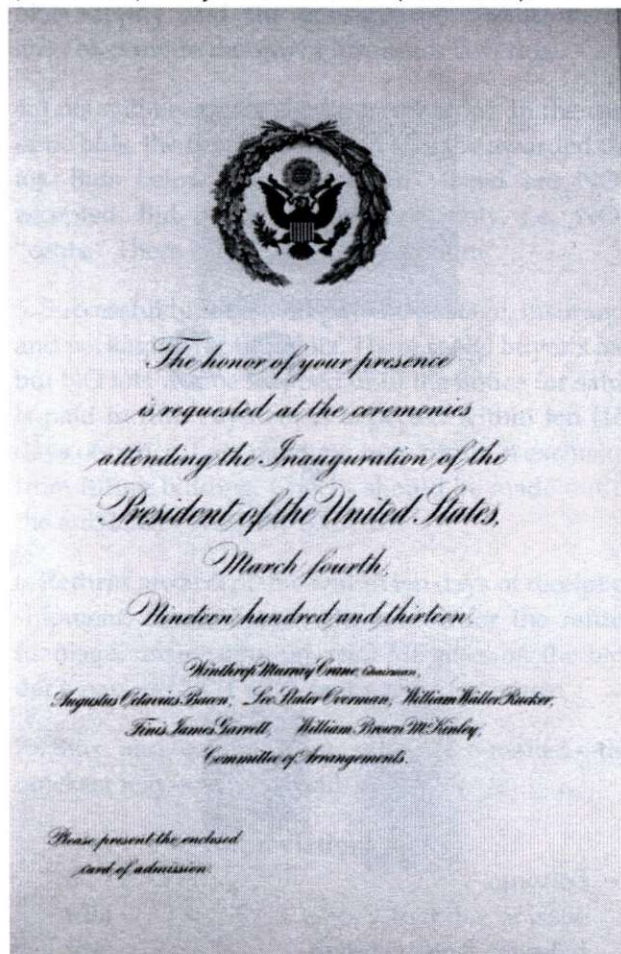


1905 Inaugural Invitation

All three cards engraved by BEP including portraits of Woodrow Wilson (1856-1924) and VP Thomas R. Marshall (1854-1925).

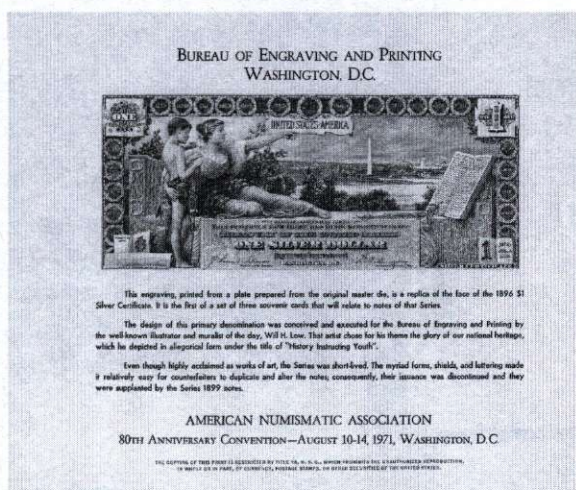

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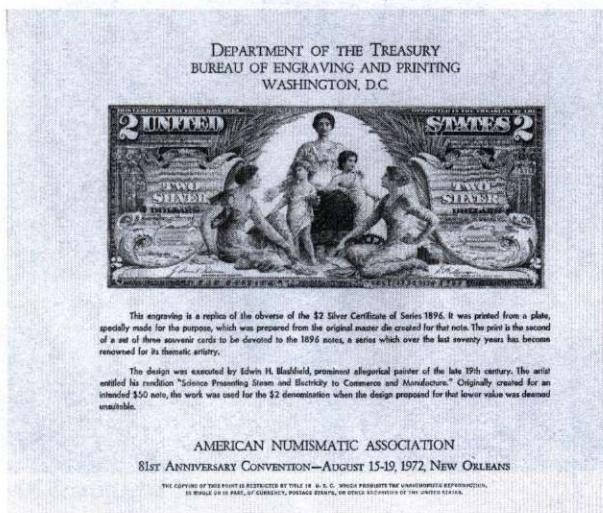

RULES:

1. Only souvenir cards, intaglio-printed material, or related items are acceptable for consignment. Interested sellers should **contact the auctioneer with any questions BEFORE sending any material**. The fastest contact is by e-mail;

2. Consignors are responsible for adequately describing their lots, including S.C.C.S. numbers and their minimum bids. Lots must be of a minimum \$1 value.

3. Consignors will pay the postage to ship their lots and postage/insurance for return of unsold material. There is NO consignment fee, however, the S.C.C.S. will retain 10% of the selling price as a commission fee. Care shall be taken to protect any material submitted, but the auctioneer and the S.C.C.S. assumes NO liability and the consignor(s) should verify and/or provide their own insurance coverage.

4. Lots will be sold to the highest bidder. In the case of tie bids, the first bid received shall be awarded the lot. Bids below the "minimum" listed are NOT accepted. Bid in \$1.00 increments only, i.e., NOT "cents." There is NO "buyer's premium".

5. Successful bidders will pay the postage, insurance and packaging for their lots. There is NO buyer's fee, but NO lots will be shipped until the notice for same is paid in full. Payment is expected within ten (10) days of notice. Late payment may result in exclusion from future bidding. Checks should be made out to the auctioneer NOT the S.C.C.S.

6. Returns are acceptable within ten days of receipt of shipment. Please specify the reason for the return (damage, mis-attribution, etc.) Mistakes on the bidder's part are NOT sufficient reason for return.

7. Bids and/or questions may be e-mailed—the quickest way—regular mail, or carrier.

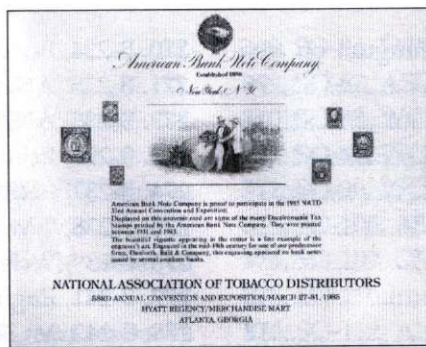

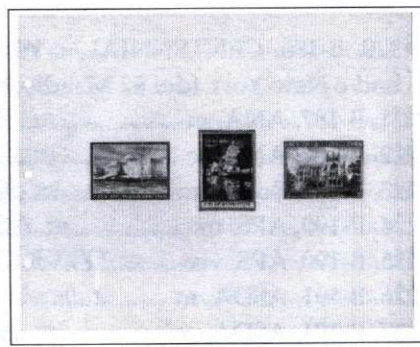

ABNCo CHECKS

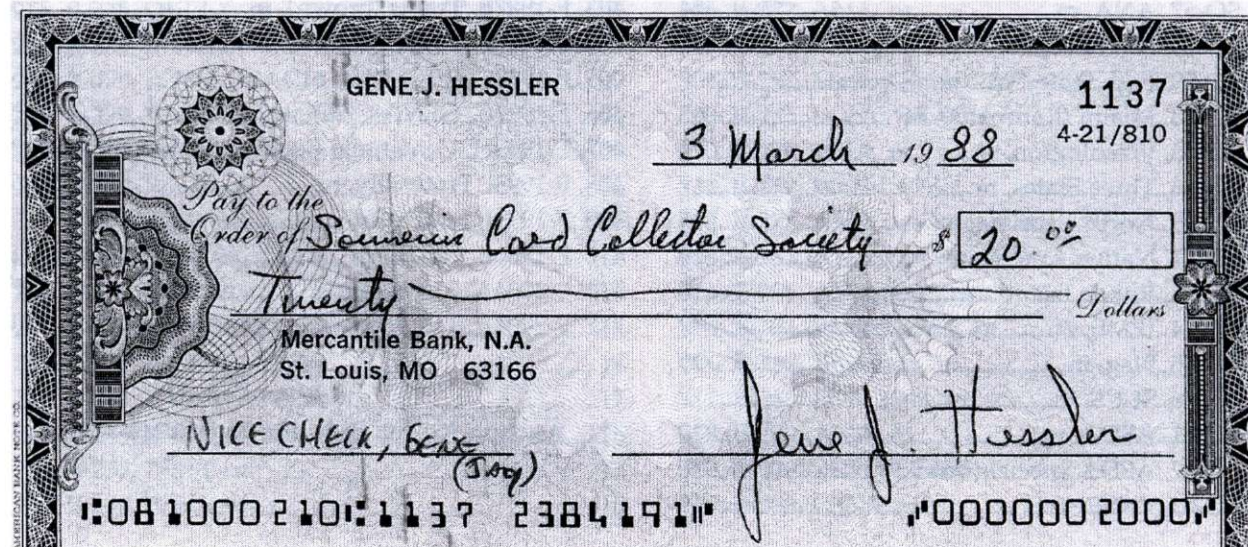
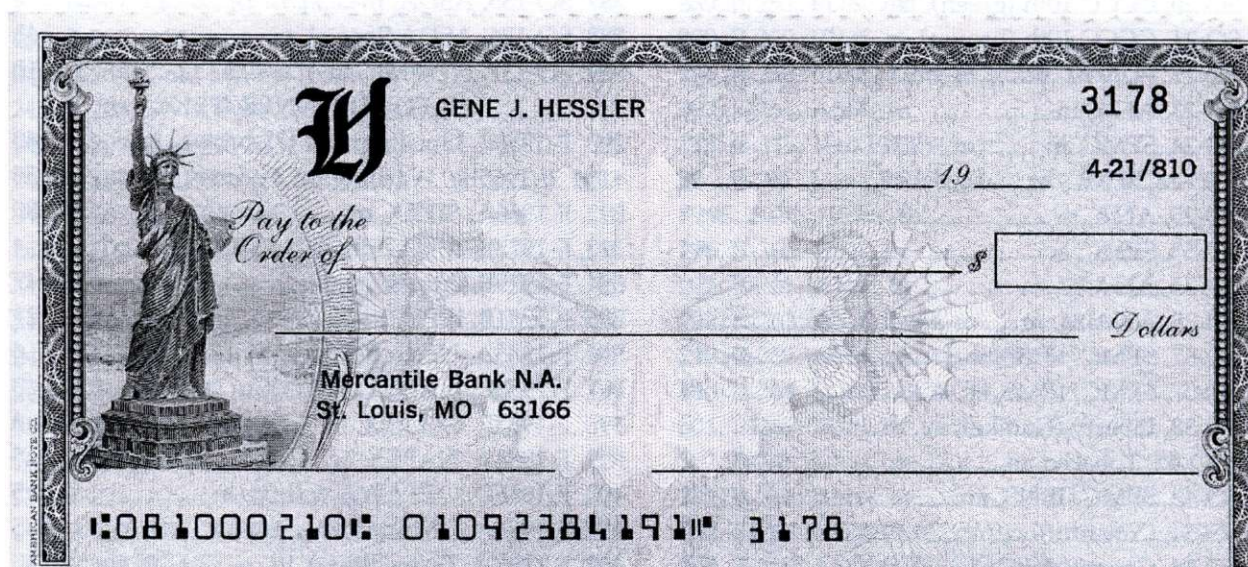
One of the greatest partnerships for many years was that of American Bank Note Company (ABNCo) and American Express. Probably millions of traveler's checks were printed by ABNCo and cashed all over the world. The fine engraving was a strong deterrent to counterfeiting and made the checks acceptable almost anywhere.

In the 1980's ABN tried a pilot program to see if they could interest private citizens in a more secure check printed for their private banks but with security engraving. Recently, I was visiting with noted numismatist Gene Hessler who showed me examples of checks that were provided for him and maybe a half dozen other collectors* for their private use. Check collectors would be happy to have examples.

One check has a nice engraving of the Statue of Liberty and borders, while the second example is an intricate geometric pattern. Gene received about 125 of each design. At the time he was serving as curator of the Mercantile Bank Money Museum in St. Louis. Gene used one of the checks to pay his SCCS dues in March, 1988. Even the treasurer, Jay [Jackson] at the time, wrote a note to Gene, "NICE CHECK."

The personalized ABNCo check system never was put into commercial production, but one of the possible 1000 to 2000 examples out there would be a nice addition to ones ABNCo collection.
